## **ATTORNEY**

The primary responsibilities of the ATTORNEY includes providing civil representation for victims of family violence, sexual assault, stalking, and crime. The position also requires performing community outreach and additional duties consistent with GLSC-DLC's other programs.

Must have a Law Degree and be barred to practice on Guam or in another jurisdiction but is prepared to take the bar examination and pass within five (5) years. Applicants must further demonstrate the ability to organize, manage and complete projects in a timely manner; develop new skills and knowledge as needed; and work collaboratively with GLSC-DLC staff, its collaborative partners and the community. Fluency in other languages is an asset.

Applicants should have a team-oriented attitude. Must be able to empathize and have an understanding for individuals with disabilities, survivors of domestic violence, minors in the court system and other vulnerable populations. Applicants must have good communication skills, efficient typing skills and computer proficiency. Applicants must also have a valid driver's license and his/her own vehicle.
